From the Minister

I hope this article finds you all well. I am delighted to be the minister of Netherlee & Stamperland Church, and I am really looking forward to getting to know you all as we journey as Kingdom people in our church and community.

I thought it might be helpful to give you a brief introduction to my background as I start this exciting time with you all. I was brought up in Glassford, or the Glessert as it is more fondly known and lived there until I moved to Stonehouse in 1991. I've always been churched; it's something that has always played a significant part in my life. Glasford Parish Church and

the Shiloh Hall in Glassford were where I spent most of my time as a child/teenager. I moved from Glassford to Stonehouse and started going to St Ninian's Parish Church in Stonehouse in 1991. I was baptised in May 1993 by Rev Tom Nelson in St Ninian's at the same time as my eldest son Stuart. My mum & dad were in the Salvation Army, so I wasn't baptised as a baby. I was always heavily involved in St Ninian's; I taught Sunday School, Bible Class and ran the YF for many years. I co-organised and ran many, many holiday clubs. I became a Board Member when I was 24 and became an elder when I was 31. Other duties I held included Clerk to the Congregational Board, Clerk to the Finance and Property Committees, Congregational Roll Keeper. I filled in all the grant forms and organised Burns Suppers and Children's Christmas Activities.

I am married to Bill, and have three grown up children, Stuart, Kirsten & Cara. I have a nearly 9-year-old Working Cocker Spaniel, Theo, who certainly keeps us all on our toes and usually has something he shouldn't have in his mouth when you meet him, like a remote control, a pair of socks or something else very random!

Looking back, I have always felt a Call on my life, and from 2004 I attended several Church of Scotland Vocations Conferences, but I always made excuses as to 'why I couldn't'. God eventually caught up with me, as He always does, and I enrolled and completed the Presbytery Word & Worship Course early 2019; this was my first-stepping stone to be guided on God's path into ministry. My discernment period in June 2019

with Rev Gordon Palmer in Claremont Parish Church East Kilbride (pictured). During this time of discernment, I applied to go to university to complete my theology degree and began studying at Highland Theological College in September 2019 for a Batchelor of Arts in Theology Degree, which I graduated from in June 2022. I was delighted to be accepted for Ministry Training within the Church of Scotland

in June 2020, which, through the Covid pandemic, was completed by assessment conferences online.

Nearly one month to the day after being accepted for ministry my husband Bill had a cycling accident in North Ledaig, where we were holidaying with our touring caravan. /...

Bill suffered a spinal cord injury and was diagnosed as tetraplegic (incomplete) and we told he wouldn't walk again or eat independently (which through sheer determination, stubbornness, and the power of prayer he has overcome). Bill spent nearly 5 months in the Queen Elizabeth University Hospital National Spinal Unit. On paper I honestly didn't think I would manage to continue my training, but God, it seems, always had this plan for me and has sustained me all the way and I feel I am right in the place he wants me to be. Bill's injury has been life-changing for us all as a family but through God's Grace, Compassion and Love we have adapted well to our new way of living. This was a valuable lesson for me to 'let go and let God'.

My 1st placement was with Rev Bryce Calder in St Mary's Parish Church in Motherwell. My 2nd placement was a full-time 4-month placement with Rev Jill Clancy in HMP Barlinnie. I absolutely loved this placement in prison chaplaincy, which due to my long involvement with the Children's Hearing System was a valuable experience for me. The



latter part of my 2nd placement saw me move to St John's Parish Church in Hamilton (pictured) with the Rev Joanne Hood, a person well-known to many of you. I left St John's to complete a 10-week full- time placement in Moncreiff Parish Church in East Kilbride with Rev Sarah Ross. I then returned to St John's in Hamilton to begin my 15-month probation period. Here I gained vast experience in many parts of ministry, especially within the role of school chaplaincy. In September 2022, I started as Chaplain to

Hamilton Academical Women's Football Team – this remains to be one of my favourite parts of my job! You may see me going around with my training kit on, being the biggest cheerleader of 'my girls'!

I was Ordained on 30th November 2023 at St John's Parish Church and remained there to begin an assistant minister's contract. In February 2024 I was delighted to be offered the opportunity to join Cambusnethan North Parish Church in Wishaw as their 'minister', albeit still on the Assistant Minister Scheme contract, where I remained for 21 months. I learned so much about me and my ministry when I was there, and they have the most amazing choir too! After prayer reflection, I applied for the vacancy at Netherlee & Stamperland Church, and this is when God's tapestry of my faith journey very much became apparent. My friendship with both the Nelson family and with Rev Joanne Hood became very much part of the weave of my Calling to be your minister. I want to take this opportunity to thank you all for everything you did to make my Induction so special. I have to admit to being annoyed that I didn't get to even see the amazing buffet, let alone taste it! We'll just have to organise another social event so that I can have a taste, and a glass of wine!

I am really looking forward to getting to know you all, getting to know all your names, and journeying alongside you all. I'm excited to see where God takes us on this part of the journey. With my love and blessings. $Jillian \chi\chi$


from those of you who may indulge in a spot of crafting and would like to consider selling your wares on the day.


